


* How to Read Graphs



1 Picture Graphs (Pictographs)

Use pictures or symbols to show data. Each picture can stand for **one** or more items.




1 Leook to read a picture graph:

- 1. Look at the title What is the graph about?
- 2. Check the key What does each picture mean?
- Count the pictures to find out the total.
- 4. Compare rows to see which has more or fewer.

2 Bar Graphs


Use bars (rectangles) to show data. Bars can go up and down (vertical) or side to side or horizontal.



- Read the title What information is shown?
- 2. Look at the labels What do the bars stand for?
- Check the numbers (scale) on the side or bottom.
- 4. Compare bars to answer questions like "Which has the most? Which has tieast?

3 Line Graphs

Use dots connected by lines to show how something changes over time.

Study Tips

- Always read the title, labels, and key first.
- Ask: "What is the graph trying to show me?"
- Look for the biggest and smallest values. Compare to see differences.
